In October we said our final goodbyes to Mary McNally and Seán Nolan, both founder members of our Community Council back in the late 1960's. For several years they served with great enthusiasm and purpose for the betterment of our local community. They were always conscious of the fears, concerns and needs of our residents and spared no effort to bring to Rathcoole and Saggart, services that we all enjoy today.

Although he did not do it on his own, it is widely accepted by all involved that Seán as well as being an absolute gentleman, was the real driving force behind the council. Acquiring the site where the Community Centre and Catholic Church now stands is one of his many achievements. While walking through the Park, you should ponder the thought of Seán and other Council members at the time, protesting outside Dublin County Council offices on O'Connell St. looking for Playing Fields for the Community. Places like the Park generally don't just happen, they are caused.

One of Marys real passions was history and in particular history of people and how they were related or connected to each other. One of her legacies/achievements is the publication of two volumes of 'A Pictorial History of Brittas, Saggart, Rathcoole and Newcastle', the proceeds of which went to support the Day Care Centre.

In thanking them for their Trojan work, the Community Council and the Community at large would like to express our sincere condolences to the McNally and Nolan families at this sad time. May they rest in peace.

Dump Approved

Behans Quarry

Public meeting 12th November 2012 8pm Rathcoole Community Centre

A new Application reference SD12A/0059 has been approved by the South Dublin County Council (SDCC) in respect of a Dump in Behans Quarry.

We are bringing this to a further planning appeal and we need your support

It is our belief that this is the thin end of the wedge and few controls will be imposed on the dump and it will gradually descend into a similar situation to that of an Incinerator that was proposed on this site a few years ago.

Rathcoole is not a place for landfill or a dump, the associated runoff and dust is not in keeping with a residential area.

There is a real risk of contamination of water & groundwater with this new Dump



This will affect our area, the amenity and the quality of life in Rathcoole We owe this to our families to object to this dump.




RAMS TO CLARE




