## **RATHCOOLE FOODIE** Sweet and Sour Bacon Chops Prep Time: 10mins Cook Time: 30mins Ready in: 40

### ..... Ingredients .....

#### 6 Bacon Chops

- 2oz/50g plain flour
- 1 egg beaten with 3floz/75ml milk
- 6oz/175g fresh white breadcrumbs
- 1 tablespoon sesame seeds1 teaspoon crushed chili flakes
- Prepare three bowls:
- 1: Seasoned flour
- 2: Egg & Milk whisked together
- 3: Breadcrumbs with chopped sesame seeds & {chili flakes optional}

#### For Sweet & Sour Sauce:

- 1 tablespoon soft light brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar/white wine vinegar
- 2 tablespoons sherry 4floz/ optional
- 110ml dark soy sauce
- 175 ml/6fl oz. chicken stock
- 2 tbsp. tomato ketchup/
- 1 Tablespoon corn flour mixed with a little water
- Dash of Tabasco sauce optional

#### For Stir-fry:

- A little oil for cooking
- ½ inch fresh ginger finely diced
- 2 cloves garlic finely diced
- 1 carrot cut into thin strips
- 1 ½ mixed peppers
   (½ each red, green, yellow) cut into thin strips
- 1 red onion thinly sliced
- 6 button mushrooms thinly sliced
- 4oz/110g fresh pineapple/1 small tin]
- 1 bunch spring onions

#### Delicious way to cook Bacon chops which works equally well with pork chops. ENJOY

#### For Chops:

Coat the bacon chops in the flour first, then transfer to the egg wash mixture and finally toss the egg coated chops in the breadcrumbs mixture and make sure they are completely coated.

Preheat the oven to 180C/350F. Line a flat baking tray with baking parchment. Heat a large pan with a little oil. Pan fry the bacon chops for 2 to 3 minutes on each side until golden brown and then transfer to the lined baking tray.

Bake in the oven for a further 20/25 minutes. For Sweet & Sour Sauce: Put the sugar, vinegar, sherry, soy sauce and chicken stock into a medium sized saucepan with the tomato ketchup.

In a separate bowl mix the corn flour with a little water to make a paste and add this to the liquids in the pot. Bring the entire mixture to the boil, whisking occasionally, and then reduce the heat to a simmer for 8/10 minutes until the sauce is of coating consistency.

Transfer the sauce to a large jug and use as required.

#### For Stir Fry:

Heat a wok or frying pan and add in the diced garlic and ginger together with the peppers, onions and carrots (which have been cut into strips) and cook them gently. After a further 6/7 minutes, pour in the sweet and sour sauce and bring this mixture to the boil.

Add in the diced pineapple and chopped spring onions just before you are ready to serve. Å Divide the sweet & sour vegetable mixture between 6 large bowls and place one of the breaded bacon chops on top of each.

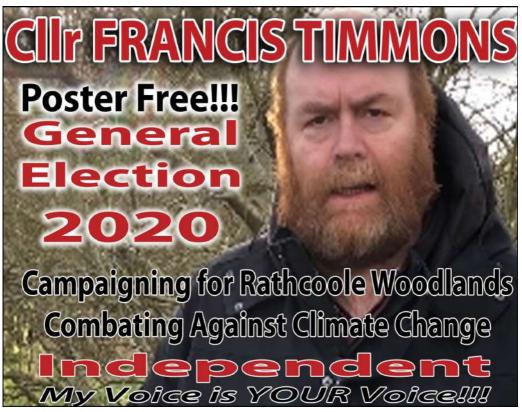

# SAVE RATHCOOLE WOODLANDS

On July 11th 2019, the Echo newspaper along with other local papers and media reported on a draft master plan for South Dublin County Council lands owned in Rathcoole. This included a proposed development of 250 houses on Rathcoole Woodland, even though there are potential alternative green field sites available.

Rathcoole Woodland is 10 Hectares 100,000Square meters of natural self-generated native pioneer woodland of willow, Birch and Beech among other trees with an average tree height of 7 metres of up to 40 years old. The Woodland provides multiple benefits such as enhancing human health and well-being, mitigating air pollution, providing a nature based solution to climate change impacts, removing Carbon, reducing flooding and providing a haven for wildlife.

The Woodland is adjacent to lands for which Romeville Developments submitted a separate application for 192 houses in November 2018 (planning SD18A/0364 and SD18A/0413). This included a 'Local Area Plan' outlining the development including a map. Both applications were subsequently withdrawn. Revised plans can be submitted for the development of these lands.

The Council refused access for a biodiversity study of the Woodland by an independent ecologist however they are undertaking their own studies in relation to the master plan. In the past year we have recorded four species of Bat; Common Pipistrelle, Soprano Pipistrelle, Leisler's Bat and Natterer's Bat, found an Oak tree, a holly tree and a Fir tree among all the Willow and Birch trees. We have seen frog spawn and an adult frog with both records sent to the Irish Peatland Conservation Council. We have also Badger prints and its latrine, Rabbits and a Fox. We recorded plants such as Figwort, and Woody Nightshade which we had not noted before. The springs now have vegetation, yet to be identified. The Woodland continues to surprise, as it grows, changes and matures.

What the future holds for the Woodland is uncertain. South Dublin County Council is continuing with the Master Plan. While it may have changed, there is no indication that the Woodland will be saved. There is a General Election on February 8th 2020. It is important that you vote for a candidate who will actively campaign to achieve the objectives of the Master Plan for Rathcoole and at the same time protect and preserve the Woodland.

A big thank you to all who signed the 'Save the Woodland' petition submitted to the Council Offices with over 2500 signatures. We are also grateful to those local Councillors who have supported us to date by raising Questions and Motions at Council and Clondalkin Area meetings regarding the Woodlands.

The Four Districts Woodland Group is holding their Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Wednesday 12th February at 8 pm in Rathcoole Community Centre. All are welcome and there will be refreshments after. Come along if you are interested in volunteering or wish to provide support and encouragement.

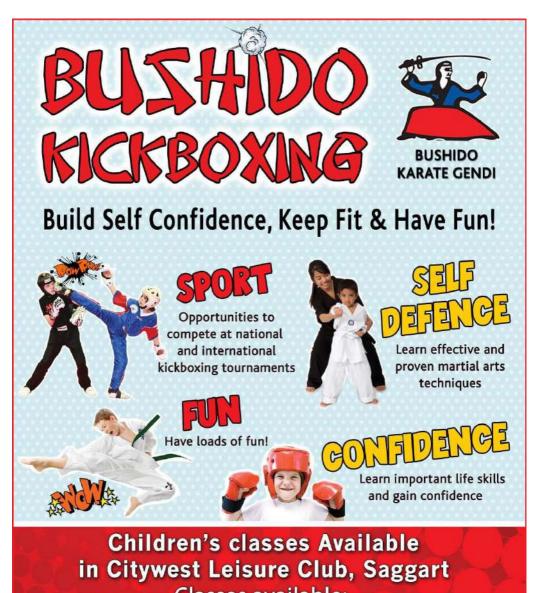

# A Bird with No Name



During December, Baldonnel Aircorp ran a competition in relation to one of its unusual but very important employees.

Captain Steven Connolly (SO Press & Public Relations Officer) at Casement Aerodrome explains,

"The aircorp Bird Control Unit (BCU) are responsible for ensuring that our skies are clear of any large gatherings of birds which could pose a problem for departing and arriving aircraft. They are an extremely competent and professional unit and thankfully (touch wood) we have not had any significant incidents with birds and our aircraft. Apart from taking care of our own fleet of predatory birds the unit also takes care of fallen birds and ensures they receive the necessary veterinary care so that they can return to the skies as soon as possible.

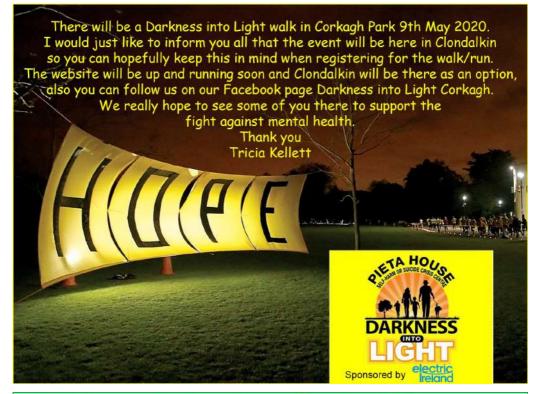
One such bird arrived on our doorstep last year and has integrated himself into the BCU family so well that when he was fit to be released back to the wild he insisted on returning back to Baldonnel. Several attempts to return the bird to the wild have long since failed and the decision has been made to employ this Peregrine Falcon to the BCU staff."

The bird, unfortunately, had yet to receive a name. The aerodrome decided to run a small competition with the local Primary Schools in the area in order to name the bird.

The winner was Abby Manning (2nd Class) from Holy Family N.S. Rathcoole. Her chosen name for the falcon was "Kody". As part of her prize, Abby and her class got to meet the new falcon when members of the Air Corp BCU team and the Brigadier General himself Rory O'Connor came to visit the school on December 19th last. They brought Kody and his new colleagues along. Here they put on a display heralding the mastery of these fantastic birds of prey. Congratulations and thanks to all!

# **GRILLED TERIYAKI**

# INGREDIENTS recipe from our 7 Pa

#### METHOD

- Start by preparing your salmon, cut the salmon fillets in half length wise. 1 Take the skewer & insert into into the salmon finger approx. 80% of the way so it looks like a lollipop.
- 2. In a bowl mix 100ml of soya sauce, 2 table spoons of honey, 1 chopped garlic clove & half of the chilli chopped & mix together gently
- 3. Poor half of this mix over the salmon & massage into the flesh. Cover in a tray & refrigerate for at least 2 hours
- Shred your red onion, pak choi leaf & stem finely. Chop the remaining 4. chilli & parsley finely, cut the scallions into long diamond style slices & set all aside
- 5. Toast the sesame seeds in a hot dry pan for no more than 30 seconds & set aside
- 6. When you are ready to assemble & serve your dish start by removing the salmon skewers from the marinade.
- Heat a pan moderately & add a little veg oil. Place the skewers in the pan 7. & cook on each side rolling gently for 2 minutes each side x 4 sides
- 8. Remove from the pan & wipe the pan clean.
- Heat the pan again & place the lime cut into 4 sections on it without oil 9. for 4 minutes or until the internal flesh has coloured, remove & set aside with the salmon
- Reheat the pan & add a little oil, quickly stirfry the onion, chilli & lastly 10. pak choi for no more than 3 minutes, just before removing from the pan add the remaining half of the soya sauce mix & the parsley, remove immediately

- 1 2 salmon fillets appox
- 2. 120g each, skinless is better but not imperative
- soya sauce (light is best) 3.
- 4. honey
- 5. 2 limes
- 6. 1 clove garlic
- 2 heads of Asian pak choi 7.
- 8. 1 red onion
- 9. seasame seeds
- 10. 1 bunch flat parsley
- 11. 1 bunch scallions
- 12. 1 fresh red chilli
- 13. salt / pepper
- 14. vegetable oil
- 15. 4 wooden skewers 150mm

#### PLATING

Spread a generous spoon of the greens on a plate & set the salmon atop. Glaze the salmon with the pan juice from the greens & garnish with the lime quarter & the shredded scallion. Lastly sprinkle the whole dish with toasted seasame seeds & enjoy!

The New Year got off to a bright start for Rathcoole Tidy Towns with approval by South Dublin County Council of traditional village signage. Welcoming signage will be erected on all approach roads with design and dimensions conforming to S.D.C.C. specification.
